Three grievances were pending at closure. Two have been resolved. JMS class size: a form for members who agree to go over class size limit. RSP caseload at VB is resolved in favor of grievant. Advisory grievance is still pending.

Bargaining—George Monge

BT is working to ensure representation of members. An important variable that is difficult to find is actionable information to give us guidance. We still have time to make decisions. Waiting for federal and state governments to make budgetary decisions. In the meantime, BT sent a survey of distance learning experiences. BT is discussing how to reopen: modified, traditional model; distance learning; hybrid model – in class with distance learning. Another survey is forthcoming. June 26 at the latest.
